Mid-Winter Regatta

1990 MC Scow Mid-Winter Championships, March 9 - 11, 1990, Lake Dora, Mt. Dora, Florida

The switch from hard-water (ice boating) to soft-water sailing went well for sailors from Minnesota, Wisconsin, Michigan and Illinois as they captured seven of the nine top places at this year's MC Scow Mid-Winter Championships. The Florida weather was outstanding with a brilliant sun and temperatures in the 80s.

Sponsored again by the Lake Eustis SC (Florida), this year's event was a good time both afloat and ashore for the thirty-five registrants from nine states including Iowa and Texas, their friends and families. Pete Smith of Atlanta and former Commodore of the International MC Class Yacht Racing Association headed the race committee.

Pete set Olympic courses for all six races (one throw-out) in mostly light and variable winds. A good breeze did pipe-up for the last race on Saturday. New MC owner Warren Love and friend Gerry Pottit both from Pennsylvania, who happened to be in Florida for a visit, came over to Lake Dora to watch the races, but volunteered their services to man a crash boat.

Top sailor was Jimmy Gluek of Bower Sails who won the (continued on page 2)

Professional Trophy with 11-3/4 points (5-2-2-2-1) followed closely by professionals Andy Burdick (13-3/4 points) and Eric Hood (17-1/2 points) of Melges Boat Works and Melges Sails respectively. Happy Fox from Spring Lake, Michigan won top amateur honors with 18 points. Sid Peterson, Pistakee YC, Illinois, took second amateur, first masters (over 50), followed by Lake Eustis sailors Dave Cleaver and A. Shafer. and Curt Bradley, Grand Rapids YC, Michigan, rounded out the amateur trophy winners with a fifth and second masters. Third place masters trophy went to Bill Crum of Lake Eustis Sailing Club.

Comments from race winners:

Eric Hood: Considering the light air in the 1st race I chose the middle of the line where a big sag developed. Happy and I were the only ones on the line and opened up a 50 yard lead almost immediately. At the weather mark Happy caught a puff and opened up a large lead (1/8 to 1/4 mile!). I closed some on the last run and just got ahead around the mark, and covered closely to win the race.

The third race was a four-boat race with Eric, Shafer, Gluek and Burdick. Eric nosed out Burdick by no more than a foot at the finish line.

Eric offered this advice for light air: Sit still. Use a forestay telltale (visible when hiking to leeward), and stay in the heart of each puff wherever it takes you.

Of the three races Andy Burdick won, he had this to say about the 5th race. "The wind piped up to about 12 mph and provided the most exciting race of the regatta. Around the leeward mark I was third to Andy and Jimmy. I tried to split from them but they covered. On a port-tack knock, I footed off, tacked and crossed Jimmy, but not Eric. Eric and I ducked each other several times and I just barely got the bullet."

Andy offered the following suggestion for light air sailing: Keep the boat moving, build speed with eased main and headed off, and then head up and trim when speed attained. Repeat to keep up maximum boat speed.
