SKIPPER'S SCUTTLEBUTT -

Congratulations to Brett Hatton for winning the '85 Nationals. Brett is 22 yrs. old, a student at the University of Colorado and a sailing instructor at Spring Lake during the summer. He has been sailing MC's for 9 years. Brett had to overcome handicaps before the race even started; somewhere between Michigan and Wisconsin there are 2 MC masts ongside the road, unknowingly having fallen off Paul Eggert's triple decked trailer. MBW was able to supply a new mast but, before the race, Brett was still jury-rigging it, since the shroud fittings were different from those on his boat. Brett's crew, when needed, was none other than his mother, a very game woman in that weather (rain, 15-20 knot winds & waves).

Brett's advice for sailing in 15-20 knot winds: traveler to edge of the cockpit in gusts; slight Vang to get bend in the mast; more Cunningham in gusts. He generally has the main cleated, working the traveler and playing the Cunningham in gusts. In the puffs, foot off rather than feather; and the harder it is blowing, the flatter you sail the boat. Keep the crew weight forward to help balance the weather helm.

Also seen at the Nationals - Wally Johnson (White Bear Lake) doing crazy-8's downwind; and many periscopes (a lot of submarining in 24 knot gusts on runs).

Other news: There will be a new perpetual trophy for the top woman sailor at the Midwinters and Nationals. Amy Eggert (10th at Nationals) & Lynn Walborn (14th) should give encouragement to other women to get involved with the MC.

Tom Wurster (Diamond Lake) has put an old M-16 sail on an MC to allow younger sailors to learn on an MC without getting over-powered. Contact Tom re modification, if interested.

Frank Keenan has generated a lot of interest in MC's in Eustis, Florida (next lake over from Mt. Dora where the Midwinters are held). Let me encourage you to try to get to the Midwinters - beautiful lake, good facilities, camping next to the launch area. For those with motorhomes - bring a long cord to reach a long-forgotten electrical outlet on an utility pole (free). Non-sailors can enjoy the antics of Charlie the Alligator, who suns uself by day and makes his rounds of the bay in the evening.
