# 61st Annual Western Michigan Yachting Association Regatta

August 8 - 11, 1990 Lake Macatawa, Holland, Mi

Four races in four days with a steady and light west wind, 85 degrees, sunshine and lots of spectators. A Margarita Fest with a fantastic steel band, and a first-class trophy presentation at the Saturday night Commodore's Ball. Not only did we have all this, but we also had 68 competitive MCs on the starting line.

You can find all of this only at a Western Michigan Regatta. The sailors who were there experienced a fun, well-run event with a good test of sailing skills.

Lake Macatawa provided the MC sailors with a long narrow windward beat for all four races.

Race number one brought a light westerly wind with very little chop. As the 70 boat fleet lined up it was clear to see that the middle to left side of the course was favored. The easiest way to determine the favored end is head the boat into the wind. Whichever direction the bow points to is the favored end. You should keep checking this until two minutes before the start.

Doug McNeil sailed a great beat to get to the weather mark first. Doug used a solid covering technique to keep myself, Christ Eggert, and Brett Hatton from getting too close. Doug stayed ahead and to windward of all of us. This made it impossible for any of us to catch him.

Race two started out in the same fashion with the same conditions. Jim Gluek had a nice start and sailed a flawless first beat to keep him in the lead. He won the race and Brett Hatton sailed well again to get second.

It was clear to see after two races that getting a good start and sailing a good first beat in clear air would put you up in the front. Once you were in the bad air and wake of the other boats it was hard to find a clean way out.

Race number three was sailed right after race two. It was hot. We had light air and we had the Margarita Fest the night before. The 68 boat fleet was worn out, suffering, and a bit dehydrated.

However, the superb head judge, Chuck Harrett, started us right away. If you stood up on your deck or even in the bottom of your boat it was clear to see that the breeze had shifted more right. The majority of the fleet again stayed left. The right side payed-off big. Dan Guidinger sailed a good

windward beat, along with Ty Nordberg. They rounded one and two respectively. Many of the previous leaders found themselves struggling to get back up into the teens.

On the last windward beat, Guidinger broke away from Burdick. This left Burdick the right side all to himself. This proved costly for Guidinger who went from first to 11th and Burdick won the race closely followed by Jim Zevalkink.

Race four brought a bit more breeze. We could now hike out and stretch our legs. Chris Eggert of Spring Lake lead the entire race until the last 200 yards. Again, not covering cost him the race. Burdick got fifty yards to the left of Eggert. This was enough to allow Burdick to sneak in front of Eggert. Chris had sailed a flawless race until then. The key to covering in any sailboat race is to stay to windward and in front of your competition. This will preserve your lead every time.

The scheduled fifth race was cancelled due to fog and a lack of wind.

The Grand Rapids Yacht Club, WMYA Commodore Curt Bradley, General Chairman Charlie Harrett, Social Chairman Claire Zevalkink, and their committees put together a new level of regatta organization, participation and social activities. They should be congratulated along with every MC sailor who participated.

Don't miss this one next year. See you all at Torch Lake.
