LAKE DAVENPORT SAILING CLUB HOSTS OCT 1-2 POLAR BEAR REGATTA

Once again, the Mississippi River served as the final testing ground (waters) for skippers completing another great season of sailing. It was an evenly matched regatta since out-of-town skippers did not have to cope with locally familiar currents (there weren't any). The regatta was a spectacular sight for those watching from the banks of the river or on the passing paddlewheelers. Nearly 60 boats of MC's, C's and Lightnings were viewed preparing for their staggered starts. A mystery MC skipper showed up with a borrowed boat and before the hot dogs realized what was happening, Chad Sprinkman, an E Scow sailor from Cedar Lake (now working in Waterloo) took top MC honors. Four skippers were practically tied for first ($\frac{1}{4}$ point difference) on Saturday so there was considerable speculation over a truck-load of beer and music from the 5-piece band that night. We saw the same four topping the final standings on Sunday. Close behind Chad were Dan Quiram from LDSC, venerable Andy Carlson from Lake Geneva, followed by Scott Ripkey of Lake Geneva and newcomer Jerry Gill from White Lake (also on a borrowed boat). Andy Carlson took home LDSC's new perpetual trophy for the Masters Champion, Dick Duley and Tony Bruskas of LDSC took 2nd and 3rd, respectively. Saturday races were started in the rain in light westerly air. Later, clusters of sailors were gathered around the club's fireplace trying to dry their buns, etc. The lone afternoon race was delayed (no air) but was finally started and run over a lo-ong W $2\frac{1}{2}$ course (W $3\frac{1}{2}$ for the other fleets) that saw some boats escorted back in after dark. Olympic courses were held on Sunday in cool, crisp medium ~~sky~~ wind that veered overnight to the north. This made it tough on the judges since the river runs east and west in Davenport. Head Judge Wally (Salty) Schwarting from Pewaukee did a splendid job with able assistance from Bob Spargo and Grant White.
