

1982 NATIONAL REGATTA - Spring Lake, Mi. - was well attended with 62 boats participating. Fleet #7 extended warmest hospitality, where there's "A Smile a Mile From Fruitport to Ferrysburg" on Spring Lake. It took a couple of days for the weatherman to catch up with that, but despite showers or downpour, everyone had a great time. We extend many thanks to Pat & Dave Walborn who chaired the event, Betty Harrett for registering all the entrants, Chuck Harrett and his race committee, Keith Wickland, protest committee, and all their supportive willing workers. The protest committee had the easiest time - there were no protests, and the 720 rule was in effect. Winds ranged between 10-12, calmed Sunday when the sun appeared, then increased again to 8-10. At one time, about 6 boats capsized, 2 were dismasted, and one unfortunate soul had a large hole punched through his deck! No doubt many skippers went home determined to put in more practice on tacking, as the windward/leeward courses were demanding in that respect. Seven races were sailed with one throw-out. First place went to Glen Walborn, Fl. #7, who also took home the perpetual trophy and The Trip Morency Memorial as winner of the first race. 2nd place, John Spargo, Fl. #20; 3rd Brett Hatton, #7; 4th Skip Johnson, #22; 5th Scott Harestad, #7; 6th Paul Richards, #10; 7th Bill Freytag, Lake Geneva; 8th Carl Reuterdaahl, #7; 9th Jon Pohlmann, #20; 10th John Bates, #20; 11th Dave Freye, Muskegon and 12th Amy Eggert #7--all of whom were awarded trophies with their crews. Attached is a listing of all finishes.

THE ANNUAL MEETING was conducted by Commodore Dave Greene and is summarized as follows: The three By-laws changes, as circulated previously, and reprinted on the reverse of this newsletter were all passed unanimously. It was requested that the Board reconsider '75 rule that a race incurring a DSQ may not be used as throw-out. All invitations for Mid-winter or National regattas will henceforth be referred to Board for approval rather than membership. 1983 Mid-winter Regatta will be held March 4-5-6 at Davis Island Yacht Club, Tampa, Fl. The 1983 National Regatta/Annual Meeting will be held at Lake Lanier Sailing Club, Flowery Branch, Ga., dates to be announced by Fl. #3. Association dues will be increased as of January 1 to \$15.00 annually. Mike Fieseler, Fl. #20 and George Dorn, Fl. #15, were elected to 3-yr terms on the Board of Governors. The Technical Committee is complete now with Herm Nickels, chairman, Pete Smith and George Dorn. Compliments were voiced to both Melges Boat Works and Johnson Boat Works for the professional manner in which both worked to finalize the builders' agreement of July 1, 1982, endorsed by IMCCSRA. Following the meeting, the current and incoming Board members met and elected John Bates, Fl. #20 to be Commodore for 1983. As soon as the designated officers are known for '83 Board members, that information will be sent out.
