Twenty MC Scows attended this year's Cow Town Classic. Fleet Captain Mark White and Regatta Co-chair Ron Stryker organized a great regatta with excellent race courses, great food and good winds. Also, on Saturday, between Race 2 and 3, most of the skippers received massages from Ron's personal trainer.

New fleet member, Brian Pace, was designated as the new fleet Beer Meister and quickly selected 'Corona' as the new fleet beer. Fleet Captain Mark White showed concern that the fleet budget might go broke over the 'Corona' issue but was quickly reminded by the group that everyone was very happy with the new Beer Meister.

Saturday night we had a great prime rib meal that included homemade pies and of course watching the sunset was another added bonus. Eric Hood, North Sails and Melges Boat Works, gave a seminar just before the skipper's meeting Saturday morning that was well received by the group.

Four races were held on Saturday and two on Sunday. Winds varied between very light, 3-5 mph, to 15-18 in the last race.

The fleet while small, was tough. Ted Keller, fresh off a win in Atlanta, Eric Hood who won in Charleston, and Pete Comfort, last year's Cow Town Champion headed the list. Katie Reese and Dave Bandstra were among the others who competed.

The key at the start was to make your decision at the very last moment. If you cruised the line and hung out towards the middle with, say, one and one-half minutes to go you were in good shape. You had to position yourself to intercept the next good puff coming down the lake.
