(Adjust between races, that is, not during.) Happy Fox, quite familiar with the lead spot, mentioned "Whatever he did, it was right; I couldn't catch him!"

FOR SAFETY'S SAKE - Both USYRU and a recent incident at Fleet #3 club indicate the time is NOW to check your boat and PFD's. USYRU cites a regatta resulting in a drowning. Solings were sailed, some quite old; two boats sank, and one sailor was lost. The story indicated clearly to MC'ers, especially those with boats originally equipped with air-bag flotation, the air-bags need to be supplemented or replaced, according to class rules, with permanent solid flotation. Moreover, make sure the styrofoam is firmly anchored and permanent. Before the season starts, throw out the raunchy old jackets you may have and replace with Coast Guard approved PFD's. Then WEAR the things! Be sure you have a good "throwable" on board, and emergency plans. Spring water temperatures and out-of-condition "bod" are poor combination!

All three days, temperatures were in the mid-60's, winds consistent about 12, dropping slightly on Sunday morning. Ten fleets were represented in the event; considering time and distances travelled, participation was good, and enjoyable.
