1992 Mid-Winter MC Championship

March 12-14, 1992, Lake Eustis, FL

Thirty-four MC-Scows converged on Lake Eustis Sailing Club to compete in the 1992 MC Midwinter Championship. We were able to complete six races with good winds and varying conditions to make for a great regatta.

The regatta opened on Wednesday with lots of new boats and many familiar faces. Lake Eustis and its sailors were there to greet all of us with open arms, great hospitality and good sailing conditions.

Day one (Thursday) saw a scarcity of wind — 6 to 8 knots, during the morning racing. Mark Christensen of Minnetonka was followed across the finish line by Andy Burdick of Lake Geneva. By the start of race two, at around 2:00 PM, the winds had stayed light and shifty with Andy Burdick leading the way followed by Dan Guidinger. At the end of the day, Andy had established a nice overall lead with a 1st and 2nd. Top local sailors were Alex Schafer in 7th and Frank Keenan in 8th.

By the time the sailors returned to shore at dusk, they were more than ready for the entertainment planned for them. Believing the sailors came to enjoy themselves on shore as well as on the water, Lake Eustis organized a great barbecue dinner at a local bar where a good time was had by all.

Friday was a sailor's delight with a 15 to 18 knot breeze on the course. It was a perfect day for a crew -- if you had one. Burdick and Gluek were back and forth on the lead, with Guidinger and Brian McMurray close behind. Jim Gluek of Pewaukee won the 3rd race as well as the 4th and 5th which put him in second overall, just behind Andy Burdick who two 2nds and a 3rd. Dan Guidinger held 3rd place followed by Mark Christensen and Doug McNeil of White Lake, Michigan. As the boats were bedded down for the night, the series leaders were all very close in points.

Saturday, the final day of racing, began quietly without much wind. The RC waited for the wind to settle in. By 10:30 AM conditions were acceptable, and the race began. A major wind shift to the left on the first weather leg did in a number on the fleet leader who had gone right. Gluek stayed middle left and had a nice lead at the weather mark and went on to win the race and the regatta.

In the amateur divison Doug McNeil took 1st followed by Jerry Gill Jr. and Brian McMurray both of White Lake, Michigan and Bill Veit of Grand Rapids. Tom Wurster of Michigan did a great job to win the masters division followed by Curt Bradley of Grand Rapids and Lake Eustis Commodore Bob DeWitt. Bob Sevey of Minnetonka took grand masters honors with Frank Keenan taking 2nd.

The sailing was complemented with refreshments after the races and two great dinners. Regatta Chairmen Dave and Terry Cleaver did a really nice job organizing a super regatta. There was great sports (continued on page 3)
