

1983 NATIONAL REGATTA - 47 skippers participated in a fine series hosted by Fleet 3. Lake Lanier provided varied wind conditions—"something for everyone," in beautiful weather. We thank everyone for coming and making this a memorable occasion. Our thanks too to Fleet 3 aptain Bob Kwasha, chairman, and all those who contributed time and effort toward a success—rul regatta: Tom Turner (certified USYRU judge) RC, Tom & Gina Payne, trophies; Anita Lenkeit, food; Sandy Myers, ceramic favors, plus various others who helped out. The race results are enclosed—no doubt about the winner, with 5 bullets and a DNS throw—out! Harry Melges III earned everyone's congratulations for a great performance and Hans Melges wasn't far behind as he took second place. We asked Harry if he would like to share his winning skills with us, and following are his comments:

"This being my first MC regatta, I was very pleased with the performance of the boat. Being the grandson and son of the designer and builder of this very responsive and highly competitive one-design yacht, it was a great thrill for me to win the Nationals. A few of the tuning skills which I have learned from my father and grandfather are what helped make my brother, Hans, and me so fast. First, we sailed with much looser sidestays and a bit more mast rake (28'1") than most other sailors. This enabled the mast to bend more, thus flattening the sail, twisting off the top more and depowering the rig enough for 160 lbs. to sail to windward with ease in the stronger winds. With this set-up, a great deal of vang, outhaul and cunningham are used depending on the total weight of the crew. The traveler was almost always on center and the main sheet worked through the puffs. We were also pulling the board up as much as 3" in the stronger wind and waves in order to keep the boat flat and driving. When the wind decreased, we would then pull the mast forward again to the standard rake position (28'3") and tighten the shrouds slightly. Very little vang and cunningham are used, depending on the size of the waves. It also seemed very effective to sit as far forward as possible in the lighter air when sailing off the wind. As well, the outhaul should be made easily adjustable for the skipper. Easing the outhaul off the wind is a must in medium and light air. The last several months I have been working in our sail oft and learning a great deal about sail shape and material. I believe that the new allprose shape and the new material we are using was a strong factor for our success."

1983 ANNUAL MEETING - The meeting was conducted October 7th by Rear Commodore Dave Greene, in the absence of Commodore John Bates and Vice Commodore David Mills who were unable to attend. Minutes are summarized as follows: Old business-IMCCSRA application for membership in ILYA will be shelved for now, more information is needed before considering any action. New business-1984 National Regatta will be held at Rush Creek YC, Dallas, in the fall, dates to be announced later as schedule confirmed. 1984 Mid-winter regatta dates/place to be announced later as plans are finalized. Dave reported on October 7th Board of Governors' meeting mainly focusing on Technical Committee report regarding unauthorized change made to Johnson boats #903-909 on which board wells were extended. The Board had agreed to grandfather these specific boats, future production to revert to current standard wells. Discussion followed and it was agreed any future changes must clear the Technical Committee, Board, and be submitted for membership approval as may be necessary.

Fleet #23, Corey Lake, Mi., was welcomed and Doug Finke accepted the charter on behalf of the new fleet. (For those interested, contact Doug at 1681 O'Bara Ct., Carmel, In. 46032.)

Two new Board members were elected by acclimation, Carl Reuterdahl, Fl. 7, succeeding himself and David Cleaver, Fl. 4, Lake Eustis, Fl., succeeding Dave Greene; each will serve 3-yr. terms expiring 12/86. The current Board members present and incoming members later met and elected Mike Fieseler, Fl. 20, Davenport, Ia., to be Commodore for 1984. A roster of Board members and positions to be served will be sent in January Newsletter.

Fleet #15 2nd Annual Spring Regatta - Lake Beulah, E. Troy, Wi. - George Dorn announced the dates of June 23-24 and invited all to attend. George also moved that all fleets clear regatta dates through the Executive Secretary to avoid conflicts.
