FROM THE COMMODORE'S DOCK

OCTOBER, 1975

Too many weeks have passed since the last newsletter, and they have all been full of sailing and related activities. With this week-end, how-ever, the "soft water" season secures in the Midwest for most scow sailors and we reluctantly store our boats in anticipation of next spring, or in the case of the MC'ers, the Midwinters at Ft. Myers, Florida - tentatively scheduled for Feb. 27-28-29, 1976.

The activity of most concern to MC members, the Annual Meeting, was held Sunday, August 17th. Sixty two members were present. After a report from your commodore regarding the meeting in Shreveport, April 26, 1975, with Bud Melges, president of Melges Boat Works, Inc., Mr. Tom Meyer, vice-president and director of marketing the MC, was introduced. Tom emphasized their objective to produce a one-design boat in agreement with the association. He presented two minor changes to the boat that the Boat Works was considering - to eliminate the board neck and to eliminate the flooring. A poll of the membership indicated a decisive approval of the board neck change but objected to the floor proposal. Mr. Meyer reassured the membership no changes would be made to the boat that would affect its performance.

Election of the Board of Governors and the Commodore was conducted in accordance with the recently adopted changes in the Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws. Bill Crum, Fleet #4, and Bob Lewis, Fleet #7, were elected to three year terms; Dan Grady, Fleet #1, and Carl Reuterdahl, Fleet #7, two year terms; Larry Price, Fleet #8, and Pete Smith, Fleet #3, one year terms; Rear Commodore (automatic) Frank Keenan, Fleet #6; and your new Commodore, Bill Crum, who will take over Jan. 1, 1976.

Invitations for the 1976 National Regatta were extended from Fleet #10, Grand Rapids, and Fleet #5, Dallas. The membership indicated their preference to be Dallas - tentatively the first full week-end in October.

MC Regattas dominated Michigan's '75 season. The MC National Regatta - Muskegon, August 15-16-17 - was outstanding. Mr. Ray Morency, with first mate, Cleo, and the hard working Muskegon Yacht Club crew, put together the "greatest" regatta. Any one of the 62 skippers who participated will attest to that fact. The Board made two notable decisions during the Regatta. One, concerning racing, prevents a skipper from throwing out a race wherein he has been disqualified. The other made Ray Morency an honorary member. The Morencys donated a beautiful Perpetual Trophy in memory of their oldest son, an avid sailor. The trophy, to be given to the winner of the first race of the National Regatta, was won by Terry Bailey, Muskegon. No one anticipated this gift and no one can fully express our thanks.

Ms. MC for 1975 - a very lovely little seven year old, Kathy Grady, Shreveport, La., who wore her crown and robe with much grace during Saturday evening's party and added a new dimension to this regatta.

The Western Michigan Regatta, held one week before the Nationals, had 43 boats in the MC fleet, largest of the five scow fleets participating. Dave Starkey, Spring Lake, repeated his 1974 victory. Larry Price, Happy Fox, Carl Reuterdahl, Jim Coffin, Tom Cassady, Bill Ruoff, Jim Bowen, Scott Caston and David Frye followed in that order. Two years ago seven MC's made up the fleet.

Lake Fenton's 2nd Invitational was sailed the week-end after the Nationals. 26 boats participated. Rain was the order of the two days only three races were sailed. Charlie Harret, Jr. picked up where he left off in the Nationals, winning again. But he did by only 3/4 of a point from a newcomer, Trisha Keenan, skippering her first regatta. Larry Price, Hugh Walborn, Happy Fox, Bob Lewis, George Nickels, Pat O'Brien, Chris Tavener and Christi Price followed.

Spring Lake's 2nd Invitational, Sept. 13-14, blew hard as it did a year ago. When it was all over Paul Eggert, this year's "Holiday-in-Dixie" winner, won with 16 3/4 points. Hugh Walborn, second - 18 3/4 and Larry Price, third - 19 3/4. Paul Richards, Gary Verplank, Happy Fox, Glen Walborn, Dave Hough, Pat O'Brien and Scott Caston made up the remainder of the first ten in the 38 boat fleet.

Regatta Oct. 11-12. Jim Kinsey, Ft. Myers, won - with 4 firsts! Karl Theiss, Orlando, was second, Wally Pack, Ft. Myers, third and Bill Crum, Orlando, fourth.

November 19 - the deadline for air bag flotation. Foam flotation will be required in all boats after this date.
