MC 2040 In the MC class, your biggest opportunity to pass boats occurs while beating to windward. It separates the top 10 percent of the fleet from the rest. If you want to be a better MC-Scow sailor, boat speed is the first place to start. In this series of articles, MC-Scow sailor and SailZing contributor Henry Chesnutt shares his secrets to speed that got him to the top of the fleet in a few short years.

#### Introduction

Helming a boat upwind is the most important skill to develop for racing MC-Scows. The goal is to find that magic combination of pointing angle, heel angle, and sail shape where the boat awakens, and to then maintain that equilibrium in the face of changing wind speeds, direction, and wave conditions for the entire race. The difference between being in the groove and being slow can be as simple as pointing a few degrees lower, putting a little more weight on the rail, or letting the mainsheet out two inches. It is a subtle affair. The groove can only be achieved when the boat becomes an extension of the skipper. Muscling the boat to windward with clenched teeth and white knuckles is a sure way to find transoms quickly; a light touch and responsiveness to the boat's needs should be cultivated. In the words of American writer and sailor John Rousmaniere:


The goal is not to sail the boat, but rather to help the boat sail itself.

Foundation 1: Heel

Every top scow sailor knows that heel angle is the single most important aspect of speed. In his book Sailing Smart, Buddy Melges states "This [heel] angle varies guite widely class to class or from one design to another, but it always applies, no matter how strong or weak the wind." Heel angle is important for a number of reasons, but primarily because it controls the angle of the board in the water. When the angle is too high or too low, the board does not dig as deeply as it could, resulting in less efficient hydrodynamic lift and more side-slippage.

Goldilocks sails too. You want the board to reach as far down as it can, maximizing the sideways surface area and lateral force that it is designed to generate. Any time the board deviates from this maximum down angle, the lateral resistance offered by the board decreases, thus making the boat slip sideways, downwind.

Proper upwind heel angle



On Lasers and other centerboard dinghies, the board exits the boat straight down. Such boats must therefore be sailed flat to keep the board as deep and efficient as possible. Scows are unique because their bilgeboards (or leeboards) exit the hull from the sides, so the boat must be heeled up in order to maintain a vertical board. The appropriate amount of heel on a scow is when the mast is 15 to 20 degrees off vertical, where the leeward rail is just touching the water. If water comes above the deck in flat water you've gone too far.



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# Fleet 55, Lauderdale Lakes, WI Celebrates its 50th anniversary

On Saturday, the 15th of July, the Lauderdale Lakes Sailing Club celebrated its 50th anniversary of organized sailing on Lauderdale. We have a chain of three smallish lakes, about 300 acres each, located 15 miles straight north of Lake Geneva. We had almost one hundred members, former members and guest join in the fun. The Venue was "Ingleside" a large compound on Middle lake that has been in the family since 1888. We had three former commodores who spoke as well as our Guests of Honor, Buddy and Gloria Melges.

Buddy arrived early and was able to meet most of the members and guests as they arrived. He was in great spirits, signing autographs on books, caps, T-shirts you name it. He even signed the host's MC sitting on the lift. We had lots of memorabilia on tables and poster boards for the group to view. We even had the bill of sale of one of the original M-16's purchased in 1966, \$1359 and included a Hifield and a Novex as attachments. Buddy had to explain what those were.

When the guests all arrived and settled in, Peter Van Kampen current commodore, gave a little history of the club. Basically 5 guys in 1966 each bought an M-16 from Buddy who later came to the lake and gave some lessons from a power boat. The Club was formed a year later. We sailed the M-16 until the middle 80's along with a "Handicap Fleet" of about equal size consisting of a wide variety of boats. The first MC #18 came to the lake in 1983. It was used. The next one didn't arrive until 1986 when Rod Nystul bought a new one. Rod was very influential and encouraged all of us to switch to MC's. So after that most of the guys were trading in their M-16's and crew's for the MC. Some say that switch saved a lot of marriages. The fleet did not really take off until the mid-1990's when we introduced a staggered start handicap system. The faster boats, determined by their individual finishes in early races had to start either 2 or 5 minutes behind. This meant that in any given race anyone could win and they do. Of our 15 race season we have 10-13 different first place finishers

each year. The better sailors continue to win the Seasonal Trophies but not all the races. It works well for our group and has resulted in the growth of our fleet. We currently have 28 MC's on Lauderdale and consistently see 17-19 boats each race.

After each of our former commodores said a few words it was time to Buddy to Speak. He started out by giving us a bit of history of the MC and then slid into his experiences with the Americas Cup. He talked about the need to practice and to focus when on the race course. He had the crowd hanging on every word. He was informative and funny. Even Gloria got into the act. She didn't formally speak, but when she thought appropriate, she spoke right up. The Club loved it.

After his talk we had a group picture taken and then shared a pot luck dinner with some artfully decorated sheet cakes for dessert. We topped it all off with some liquid refreshments as the sun was setting. A great time was had by all.

# THE 2018 MELGES MC



Melges has some exciting news! Through the summer of 2017 The Melges Team in Zenda, Wisconsin has been working through, sailing and promoting a new MC. The 2018 Melges MC has been introduced and is currently in full production. This is exciting news for the MC fleet nationwide. Interest level in MC sailing right now is at a high.

When beginning to think about creating a new boat concept— how does Melges get to the end goal? What were the deciding factors? How new of a boat is it? Let's review some of the bullet points that paved the road for Melges. Please review the photos provided. Pictures say 1,000 words!

# How did Melges arrive at the end goal?

We listened to our customers. We continually listen to the MC fleet and the people sailing these boats. There was positive discussion coming from the MC sailors around the country. Here were the main points.

- 1. We want to hold on to a deck edge or hook our legs under the deck edge for light air downwind sailing and light air upwind sailing.
- The new internal deck edge is smooth, much more comfortable and eye appealing. The boat looks great! You have much more opportunity to "lock in" with your hands and legs.
- 2. We want to see the boards.

  Sailors wanted to see the board height or angle from the top deck level. The 2010-2017 MC boards were under deck and could not be viewed. There are advantages to that design; however, the sailors wanted to see the boards.

  They wanted to be able to reference the

height of the board visually. The 2018 boat has featured this.

- 3. We want full accessibility.

  The sailors wanted to be able to access all control lines, board lines and mechanics. The 2018 Melges MC makes it easy to access all locations. You have the ability to view or change lines as you need replacement over the years. Full access with the 2018 boat.
- 4. We want more room.

  One of the best things Melges and the class did was to extend the cockpit in the aft section. Opening up that area was terrific. With the 2018 Melges MC the cockpit is open aft still and open under deck in the forward area. There is a lot more room making it easier and more convenient to store
- life jackets, paddle, throwable device, a cooler or anything else you may want to take. When it is time to travel there is much more room for sails, covers and your boom. If you want more room, the 2018 Melges MC has it.
- 5. We would like more added features. The New 2018 Melges MC certainly has some advancement. One of the best features is the composite tiller. High quality, White in color no more varnishing, aging, cracking of wood tillers. The foam non-skid floor is comfortable and adds grip to your sailing! The laser cut shapes inside the boat adds to the eye appeal. There are many other features and options. Contact Melges to review a Melges MC price sheet that includes all available options.

#### What were the deciding factors?

Melges listens carefully to the sailors. Several years of careful listening lead us to the arrival of the 2018 Melges MC. Here were the deciding factors.

- 1. Proof: So many sailors were hanging on to their existing boats. This lead to fewer used boats in the market place which ultimately leads to less growth within the fleet. More new boats, more turnover and more new sailors get into the MC fleet. This helps to create more fleets, more participation and more fun sailing!
- 2. Discussion: After discussing, designing and then implementing we would test sail the boat and after much discussion with our team we were all in agreement that this new model would be a shot in



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the arm that the fleet needs. The boat looks amazing and it sails that way too.

- 3. Let's test it: The only way to really find out what you have is to race the boat and put it through the test. The new boat debuted at this year's National Championship in Dallas, Texas then it went to the Wisconsin State Championship, the ILYA Invitational, the MC Masters National Championship, and the ILYA Championship. The boat performed at a high level in all of the events. Now it was time to see what the sailors thought.
- 4. Listen More: With the Melges MC tour we were able to see the sailors' reaction toward the new 2018 Melges. The response was all positive just what we were hoping for. It proved to

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- us that the listening that we were doing over the last few years was clear and concise. The response from the fleet was overwhelming.
- 5. New Promotion, New Energy: With new platforms in place at Melges, we knew that we could bring excitement to the fleet with new photos, new video and new ways to show off the 2018 Melges MC. The boat will be featured in our new melges.com website which will be released soon. The timing for the New Melges MC is spot on.

# What do we mean by new? How new of a boat is it?

The new 2018 Melges MC is produced out of the same class-approved hull mold and deck mold as the previously built Melges MCs. There is zero change to the shape.

The changes are in the structure and appearance of the boat. The 2018 Melges MC is a hybrid of the 2010-2017 boats as the deck has the same radius edges as the previous models.

The mast and boom are the same. All of this means that the one-design integrity is in place as it has been for decades.

Melges is excited for the MC fleet! We are excited to see the positive response. We are excited about the potential growth in the class and the positive new hype that we are seeing via social media and other promotional platforms. We are excited to promote, build and deliver a high quality sailing product for sailors across North America.

#### Fleet 05 - Rush Creek YC, TX, June 2017

#### DAY 1

Three champagne races at Rush Creek Yacht Club for the MC National Championship

Mark Tesar leads the event with 12 points. Kenny Wolfe follows close behind with 15. Race wins went to Ivan Lopatin, Eddie Cox, and Bill Draheim.

Tesar and Wolfe are the only MCs to have three single-digit finishes after three races. It's a very competitive fleet here at Rush Creek Yacht Club; eight former National Champions currently sit in the top twenty. Races one and two saw a consistent 15-17 mph. Breeze decreased with velocities of 12-15 mph for race three, bringing some larger oscillating shifts.

Champagne Conditions! Racing continues tomorrow.

#### DAY 2

Three more fair races at Rush Creek Yacht Club for the MC National Championship

Mark Tesar holds his lead over the fleet with Eddie Cox close on his heels. North Sails won all three races of the day: Mark Tesar, Eddie Cox, and Will Crary.

Nonstop fun and great racing for Day Two of the 2017 MC National Championship! Conditions were fantastic. Sunny racing with a beautiful breeze. Races saw perfect velocities of 12-18 mph for races 4, 5, and 6 here at the Rush Creek Yacht Club.

Final Shootout tomorrow. Day three will be an exciting day with Race 7 in the morning. Biggest winds of the event are predicted with 17-20 mph for the final race. With such a deep competition, the talk early on was that the title would come

down to the last beat of the last race. It's looking like that will be the case for Race 7. The throwout race kicks in and that will tighten the standings up even more. Math says eight boats can still win but it is looking like an epic shootout between Cox and Tesar tomorrow . It will all boil down to the very last race.

# EDDIE & KATE COX WIN MC NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Epic final shootout between Mark Tesar and the Cox siblings

Eddie and Kate Cox took the MC National Championship title in a brand new Melges MC Scow powered by North Sails. It is the first MC Nationals win for the sibling duo from White Bear Yacht Club. They won three out of seven races.

The title came down to the final race. Leading up to the final day's one scheduled race, Cox was close at the heels of regatta leader Mark Tesar. It was Cox vs Tesar in the final shootout. Cox set up on the starting line immediately to leeward of Tesar. Cox's boat speed put his bow out, and just after the cannon the race was his to control. At the first windward mark he had a 30 second lead ahead of Kenny Wolfe and Virginia Hannen, the second place boat. Tesar was 18 boats back. Cox led the race wire to wire, holding off Wolfe and Tesar. Tesar climbed back on the last beat and finished with a 13th place, the deepest finish in a very strong, consistent regatta for the MC veteran.

The day started with winds blowing 20 to 26 mph. A very patient Principle Race Officer Chip Mann and the race commit-

tee team held the fleet onshore until the breeze came down to 15 to 20 mph. It was fun sailing all regatta long with fair racing in moderate to heavy winds on Lake Ray Hubbard. Rush Creek Yacht Club proved to be a great venue for the championship, bringing masses of volunteers, strong leadership, and an excellent racetrack.

Andrew Vandling won the Youth Division. Katie Arvesen took the Women's Division. In the Grand Master's Division, Greg Gust edged out Eric Hood and Kelson Elam. Mark Tesar won the Master's Division followed by Bill Draheim and Ron Baerwitz. Mike Keenan took the Mega Master's Division. In the Singlehanded Division, Mark Tesar beat out former US Sailing Team member Andrew Casey and Ivan Lopatin. Races were won by Eddie Cox, Mark Tesar, Bill Draheim, Will Crary, and Ivan Lopatin.

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#### **Inland Yachting Association Championship**

#### Fleet 31 - Lake Geneva YC, WI

The Young Guns of MC sailing dominated the top 10 of this year's 71 boat ILYA MC Championship. Three Youth teams were in the top ten, won the event overall and also won the top Woman Skipper Division.

This was the final year of the designed three year plan to sail the big championship at Lake Geneva and showcasing the new Buddy Melges Sailing Center. LGYC had a great three year run for sure, setting the bar very high for the future.

Winds were challenging but fair. For the MC class, we had three solid races with medium/heavy winds. A scheduled six race series; we saw on day 1 (too much wind) and abandonment on day 3 (no wind). It takes three races to be an official championship and PRO Mark Prange, along with his great RC group, did a perfect job getting our minimum three races in on day 2. Conditions for Friday's racing were winds from the WNW ranging in velocity from 9-18mph. A little shifty, for sure, but still very fair. Courses were WA3s. Race 1 was 45 minutes long with .7mile legs, race 2 and 3 were 43 and 38 minutes long with .65 mile legs. Our starting line for 71 boats was .28 mile long.

Just looking back on the racing this week, it was exciting to see all the division winners in the top ten of this year's big ILYA Championship. Your overall

winner Ryan Grosch (Lake Harriet) and his crew Jessie Albritton, not only won this year's championship, they were also winners of the Youth Division. Just one point behind, we saw the Strothman family (Lake Geneva) with skipper/dad Peter along with sons Bo and Grady . We also saw a strong third place showing from Gordon Lamphere (Lake Geneva) and he was also the top single-handed sailor. Another division winner and Top Master was Mark Tesar (Clear Lake) who finished fourth. Rounding out the top five on the Rocket Monster was skipper/dad Mike Kaiser with Kamron and Kasha Kaiser for crew. Your top Grand Master, finishing in sixth, sailing really well was Boss Hog himself Steve Avery from Okoboji. From Gull Lake Vince Driessen with Martha Gabriela and Natalie Driessen finished seventh . Race three winner, Henry Chesnutt and Sarah Edie finished 8th plus they were second in the Youth Division. Chris Tornehl from Wissota was ninth. Top Woman Skipper plus third Youth and finishing tenth overall was skipper Natalie Sinn (Harriet) with crew Paige Boegeman.

Lessons learned, at least for the three races we had in solid but a little shifty breeze, was be fast off the line, hike hard as you can with vang on as needed (to keep boat from being nervous up and down) but not too much (as to lose pointing ability off the line). Stay with the flow, for sure. That is, stay with the top ten boats and their general position on the first beat. With 71

boats it really is about getting to the first top mark in good shape. Also, dealing with waves, both powerboat, when they came and just the waves from the wind was pretty important this week. The flatter you sailed the boat the more the boat went up and over the waves. Downwind was fun as gains were there to be had as the wind was showing on the water and the puffs/wind zones were easy to see. All in all, some great sailing, tough sailing & fair sailing for the championship.

In closing, I will say the ILYA's decision to have the big championship here at LGYC and the Buddy Melges Sailing Center was a huge success. The sheer number of entries and folks attending is a testament to this success of LGYC running a great event three years in a row. When you run big events or even small events run your process through a filter that asks the question "are the folks not sailing having as much fun as those folks sailing." If the answer is yes, then you have a great regatta. LGYC gave us their best and it was fantastic. Thank you from all of us in the MC Fleet and I bet the other fleets as well.

One other note of interest, I personally met several folks who came to see the new MC deck design and of course the big championship. Folks from St. Louis, Chicago, New York, Florida and Michigan came to specifically see our two new MCs at the regatta with the new deck style and design.
