## Fleet 57 Coos Bay YC MC Scow Fleet

Fleet 57 Coos Bay Yacht Club at Lakeside, Oregon was chartered on September 29, 1997. Fleet Captain Randy Lau submitted the following article about the fleet and its club.

The Coos Bay YC is located on South Tenmile Lake; about 3 miles from Lakeside, Oregon and 6 miles from the Pacific and 100 miles north of the Oregon/California border. Our serpentine shaped lake nestles in the foothill of the Coastal Mt. range.

CBYC's clubhouse includes full kitchen facilities, some storage lockers, and space in the basement. Restrooms and showers are provided on the grounds. A new on-site launch ramp accommodates fixed keel boats like the Santana 20. Dock facilities include slips for the San Juan 21 fleet, other fixed keel crafts, and power boats. There are also pull-up dry docks for smaller boats, including the MCs.

Our sailing season generally begins in late April and runs through September. Spring, Summer and Fall Racing Series on Sunday afternoons include separate starts for our A, B, and Junior fleets and a Sundowner Racing Series on Wednesday evenings. Races are Portsmouth handicapped with the MCs sailing with Geary-18s, San Juan 21s, and Lasers. The junior program utilizes Lasers, C-Larks, Sunfish and Holder Hawks.

The first MC Scow (#357) showed up at CBYC around 1977. Bruce Harlan moved from the C-Lark fleet, and ordered an MC from Melges Boat Works. His boat was delivered along with a truck load of M-20s to Boise, Idaho where Bruce picked up his boat. The second MC (#680) at CBYC was purchased by Jim and Claudia Moore after they sold their Hobie 16 in 1982. The Moores had become Club Champion in handicap racing in the Hobie and decided to give Bruce some competition. They picked up their MC at Boulder, Colorado having been delivered by one

of the Melges clan attending school there. After several years of "shakedown" racing the Moores won the club Championship in 1986. Later the Moores moved to the Geary-18 fleet and Greg Nyhus purchased #680.

In 1986 Claudia's father, Steve Herman and his wife, Joyce, took a holiday and drove to Wisconsin and Melges Boat Works to look at MCs. Steve purchased #977. He also purchased #314 from Bob Thurlow for Randy and Donna Lau and piggy-backed it on #977 for the trip back to Oregon. When Steve passed away in 1993, Randy and Donna Lau purchased #977. #314 was sold to Tom Stark of Bend, Oregon. This boat returned to CBYC when Jerry Hogue purchased it from Tom Stark.

Social activities at CBYC are almost year-round. During the offseason (winter) we have Membership Musters for social gathering which include the January Chili Feed, a Valentine's Day Breakfast at the clubhouse in February, the Boat Show in April, Adult Sailing School in late April, Junior Sailing School in early June, and at the end of the season, in November, the Commodore's Banquet and Annual Awards.

During the sailing season we host monthly membership meetings and potluck luncheons at the club house, and other social activities have included wine tasting, 4th of July fun races and fireworks (by the Lakeside Fire Department), a mini-regatta during the Memorial Day weekend, and ice cream socials on the grounds.

Our largest event is our Labor Day Regatta. This generally involves the whole membership in preparation and execution. A three-day event, the program normally includes five races over two days, a spaghetti dinner on Saturday night, and a barbecued salmon dinner with awards on Sunday night. Monday is set aside for Junior Regatta Races.
